LETTER FROM SUE

Dear Families First Community,

For all nonprofit leaders, this year has been a call to action on several fronts. In addition to focusing our efforts on supporting families disproportionately impacted by the pandemic, Families First continued to innovate and find ways to advance racial equity and social justice.

Over the past fiscal year (July 2020 – June 2021), we expanded our Parent Leadership work across Greater Boston. Putting parents at the center of the work recognizes the importance and value of authentic family engagement as a powerful way to drive change. The latest Parent Leader Fellows [see page 7] contributed mightily to various agencies and local coalitions in Greater Boston.

This report demonstrates Families First's efforts to ensure that Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging continue to be an integral part of what we do and who we are. This work highlighted the need to revamp human resources practices, to institute learning sessions for staff, and to embrace diversity at all levels of the organization. Our goal is to create a culture that fosters acceptance and community for all.

Lastly, I am excited for growth. Our high-impact programs will continue supporting families and partnering with parent leaders both locally and statewide. In fact, a plan to launch programming in Western Massachusetts in 2022 is already underway. This is further evidence of Families First's commitment to scale up; next year, we will reach more families on the road to ensuring that all children's earliest years are full of potential and promise.

POWER OF PARENTING HIGHLIGHTS



PARENTS ENGAGED, BENEFITING OVER 600 CHILDREN

In our virtual Power of Parenting program, parents build strong, stable, and responsive relationships with their children, social support systems, and stressmanagement and self-care practices.



INCREASE IN NUMBER OF PROGRAMS

In FY21, Families First offered 22 Power of Parenting programs—our highest number of programs ever and a 38% increase from last year!

PROGRAM IMPACT

Families First outcomes are based on the PROTECTIVE FACTORS FRAMEWORK,* which includes:

Knowledge of Parenting & Child Development Social & Emotional Competence of Children Parental Resilience & Family Functioning Social Connections
Concrete Support in Times of Need

As a result of our Power of Parenting program, parents reported improvement in areas related to the Protective Factors and parenting stress—an additional metric added in FY21. Last year, **96%** of parents improved in at least one area, **79%** improved in two, and **61%** improved in three areas.

PARENT LEADERSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

Through our Parent Leadership program—which officially launched in FY21—we worked on a broader scale to elevate parents from the community to take the lead on projects at local agencies that impact families and children.

In our first year, we worked with thirteen Leadership Fellows who delivered projects with the potential to benefit thousands of additional families. Examples of past and current community impact partners include:

Families First is continuing its journey to improve DEIB and has identified key areas for concentration for the next fiscal year.





